## CARES Act Grant Reporting – Initial Reporting 6/18/2020

Yeshivas Be'er Yitzchok has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Yeshivas Be'er Yitzchok will receive or has received a total of \$69,997 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Yeshivas Be'er Yitzchok has disbursed \$18,650 to 40 students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of 6/18/2020.

The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of 6/18/2020 is 51.

The method used by Yeshivas Be'er Yitzchok to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive is based on the allocation that the school received for the student grants, the number of Title IV eligible students, expenses for food, housing, course material, equipment needed to participate in the educational program due to the disruption of campus operations, travel home expenses and health care related expenses. The CARES Act Emergency Financial Aid Grant awarded to dependent students ranged from \$200-\$600 and for independent students from \$1000-\$1200.

Students received the following instructions with their grants: "As per the CARES Act, these grants are to be used for expenses that are related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19, including things like course materials and technology as well as food, housing, health care, and childcare.
